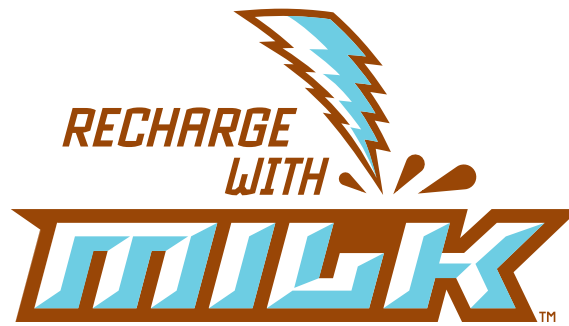

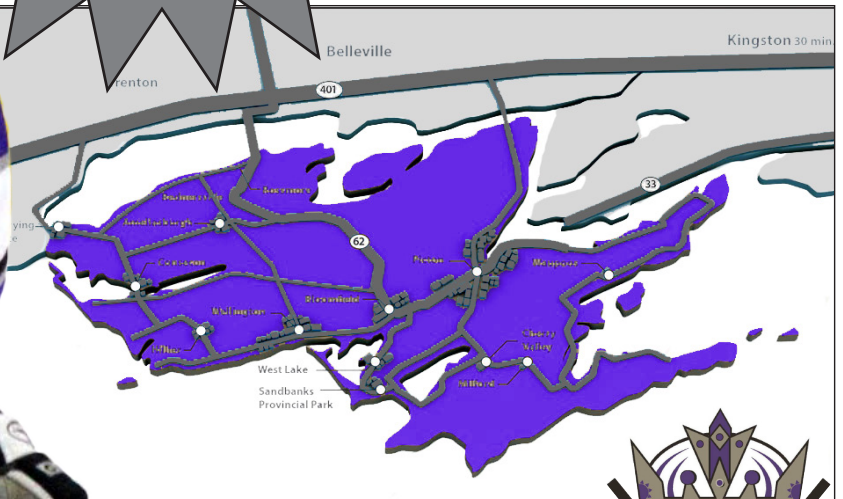

The Prince Edward County Kings invite you to participate in the Seventh Annual "Recharge With Milk" Autumn Tournament – becoming known as simply The Milk Tournament. The dates are October 28–30 in beautiful Prince Edward County, Ontario with games in Wellington, Picton and nearby Deseronto. Our Tournament will host Novice through Midget divisions, BB through DD, plus AE3–AE5, (in Atom and Above).

The tournament is sanctioned by the OMHA and as such OMHA rules will apply to the event.

We reserve the right to accept teams on a first-come basis, provided the applicant's eligibility and centre classification match the intended target group. The entry fee must be included and will guarantee you spot if accepted and cashed.

A schedule will be posted on the PECMHA website and distributed by email at least 10 days before the event. The plan is to begin no earlier than 8:00 am on the 28th and end no later than 5:00 pm on the 30th.

The tournament fee is \$925. The goal is six teams per division. The following are features of this event:

- 4 game guarantee.
- No "Gate" Fees
- Milk, from sponsor, after each game
- MVP Medals for all Novice to Pee wee games.
- Take home trophy for Divisional Champions
- Individual Champions will receive custom-cast "PEC shaped" medals; Medals for all other Finalists.
- Each Novice to Bantam player will receive a souvenir memento.
- Each team will be assigned a local team host to assist with any local arrangements

RULES & REGULATIONS

KEY RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All rules and regulations, including infractions, suspensions and discipline are subject to OMHA rules.
2. Team rosters are limited to 19 players, including goalies.
3. Team officials are responsible for their player's and parent's conduct both on and off the ice.
4. Each team will be assigned a local host who will meet the Manager no later than 45 minutes before each game; teams need to be prepared to play 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start of the game.
5. Division games are 10-10-15 with a 2-minute warm-up; Final and Championship Games are 10-10-15 with a 3-minute warm-up (time permitting and subject to change).
6. All time is stop time unless the score exceeds a 4 goal differential.
7. No Timeouts in non-championship games.
8. All teams will bring 2 sets of sweaters. The team assigned to be home will wear light colour; visitors will wear dark. Referee will have final say if a conflict arises.
9. The Tournament Chair and/or PECMHA President will have final say in all questions or disputes arising from the tournament.
10. Cancellations within 30 days forfeit fee paid; Cancellations between registration and 30 days before are subject to a 20% cancel fee.

POINT ALLOCATION FOR TOURNEY GAMES

Game lengths are 10-10-15 stop time. Point allocation is as follows:

WIN 2, TIE 1, LOSS 0

If Teams are Tied in Points after the Division Games then the following will be used to break the tie(s):

1. Winner of the game played between the tied teams
2. Team with the most games won.
3. Team with the most games tied.
4. Team with the fewest goals against.
5. Team with the fewest penalty minutes
6. Coin Toss (Home is heads / Away is tails – position based on who was who in game against each other.)

INFO ABOUT PECMHA & OUR HOME

ABOUT PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY AND PECMHA

Prince Edward County is located in South-Central Ontario. It is an “island” in Lake Ontario with five ways to approach it: two swing bridges; two large bridges or a link by ferry from the East. In the West you can enter The County (as it is often referred) South of Trenton in Quinte West; or in the middle through Belleville; or the Tyendinaga First Nations Territory. From the East or Kingston/ Napanee you can take the scenic Glenora Ferry (no charge) and enter our community.

Prince Edward County is home to the Prince Edward County Minor Hockey Association, a 370 strong youth hockey league that play in both Picton (the largest town in PEC) or Wellington (to the West of Picton). PEC is home to the 2011 Dudley Hewitt Cup (Central Canadian Champions) Wellington Dukes and the 2013 Schmalz Cup (Provincial Junior C Champion) Picton Pirates. Wellington hosted the 2014 Dudley Hewitt Cup.

6 COOL THINGS TO DO WHILE YOU ARE IN PEC:

1. No trip to the County is complete without a trip to Sandbanks – any season it will amaze; Outside the gates is an a mini-putt.
2. Visit Black River Cheese Factory (Black River)
